An internationally renowned expert on Japanese economics and U.S.-Japan relations, Dr. Lincoln is a senior fellow at the Council on Foreign Relations and serves on the board of directors for the *Journal of Japanese Studies*. Beginning in 1994, he served a two-and-a-half year term as Special Economic Advisor to Ambassador Walter Mondale in Tokyo, Japan. His books include *Arthritic Japan: The Slow Pace of Economic Reform* (2001), *Troubled Times: U.S.-Japan Trade Relations in the 1990s* (1999), *Japan=s New Global Role* (1993), and *Japan=s Unequal Trade* (1990). He is currently conducting research on the evolution of Asian economic regionalism and its implications for American foreign economic policy. Dr. Lincoln received B.A. from Amherst College, M.A. and Ph.D. from Yale.
