Michael Yahuda was a Professor of International Relations at the London School of Economics and Political Science, University of London from 1973 to 2003. Now he is a Visiting Scholar at the Sigur Center for Asian Studies, the Elliott School for International Affairs, George Washington University, DC. He has been a Visiting Research Fellow at the Australian National University and a Visiting Professor at the University of Adelaide (Australia) and the University of Michigan. He has also been a guest scholar at the Woodrow Wilson Centre, Washington, DC and the Fairbank Center for Asian Studies at Harvard University to which he is still affiliated. His main fields of research are China's politics, foreign policy and the international relations of the Asia Pacific. He has published five books, 150 articles and is a regular broadcaster on radio and TV networks on East Asian affairs.
