Ming Wan is an Associate Professor in the Department of Public and International Affairs, George Mason University. He received his Ph.D. from the Government Department at Harvard University in 1993. He held postdoctoral fellowships at Harvard from the Program on U.S.-Japan Relations, the John M. Olin Institute for Strategic Studies and the Pacific Basin Research Center of Kennedy School of Government. Professor Wan was a visiting research scholar at Tsukuba University and a Luce Fellow in Asian Policy Studies at the Sigur Center for Asian Studies of George Washington University and the Woodrow Wilson Center. He has published two books: *Human Rights in Chinese Foreign Relations: Defining and Defending National Interests* (University of Pennsylvania Press, 2001) and *Japan Between Asia and the West: Economic Power and Strategic Balance* (M.E. Sharpe, 2001). His current research interests include Sino-Japanese relations, human rights legalization in China, and international political economy of East Asia.
