For the second season in a row, AU will face Lehigh in the Patriot League Semifinals. Last season, the Eagles won a double overtime, 1-0 thriller when **Andrew Herman** scored in the 107th minute. Three of the four teams in the tournament are the same as last year. The only newcomer is Lafayette which replaces Navy as the fourth seed.

### LAST TIME OUT

American 2, Colgate 1 — Nov. 9, 2002; Hamilton, N.Y.  
Needing a win or a tie to clinch a spot in the Patriot League Tournament, AU earned a 2-1 victory in the final match of the regular season at Colgate. **Andrew Herman** netted both goals to give him 11 in the regular season. **Kris Kuykendall** had both assists for the Eagles. The back four of **David Pryor**, **Charlie Koniver**, **Sean Albright** and **Robert Rezek** performed well with **Michael Behonick** having to make only two saves in the match.

### THE COACHES

American University's **Todd West** (George Mason '88), is in his third season as head coach of the Eagles with a career record of 33-23-5 [582]. West reached the 30 win mark faster than any coach ever at AU. He is assisted by **Gary Kingsley** (George Mason '86), **Nick Stames** (George Mason '86), and **Stephen Pedicini** (American '01).

## PATRIOT LEAGUE HONORS

Four Eagles earned All-Patriot League recognition this season with three AU players making the First-Team. Senior co-captains **Kris Kuykendall** and **Larry McDonald** earned their second All-Patriot League First Team selections. Kuykendall leads the midfield and currently has one goal and seven assists on the season. McDonald anchors the backfield for AU as the team has posted seven shutouts and a 1.12 goals-against average this season. The duo are joined on the squad by sophomore **Andrew Herman**, the 2001 Rookie of the Year. Herman leads the team and the Patriot League with 11 goals and 29 points. Sophomore **Shawn Kuykendall** was named to the All-Patriot League Second Team after leading the league in assists with 11 and also finishing second in the league in points with 23.

## TOURNAMENT PREVIEW

Three of the four teams from last year's tournament return in 2002. American faces Lehigh in a rematch of the 2001 semifinal while Lafayette takes on Holy Cross. In the regular season, AU and Lehigh tied while Lafayette defeated the Crusaders, 1-0. American defeated Lafayette 2-1 while falling to Holy Cross 3-2 in double overtime. Seven of the Patriot League's top-10 point scorers will be in action this weekend with three of the players being from AU.

## REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK

With the 2002 regular season coming to a close, AU's men's soccer squad is making its own mark on the school's record book. **Kris Bertsch** has moved into third all-time in career assists (20) and ninth all-time in career points (53). **Shawn Kuykendall** is tied for second all-time in assists in a season (11) and eighth all-time in career assists (15). In addition, **Andrew Herman** is now tied for eighth all-time in goals (21) and tied for ninth with Bertsch in points (53).

## ALL-TOURNAMENT ALL AROUND

AU did quite well with six players earning all-tournament honors this season. Senior back **Larry McDonald** was named the D.C. College Cup Tournament MVP and sophomore midfielder **Shawn Kuykendall** earned Tournament MVP honors for the Penn State/Nike Classic. McDonald was also named to the Penn State/Nike Classic All-Tournament Team while Kuykendall made the D.C. College Cup squad. Sophomore forward **Andrew Herman** and senior back **David Pryor** were named to the All-Tournament Team for both the D.C. College Cup and the UConn/adidas Classic. Senior goalkeeper **Michael Behonick** and senior midfielder **Jeff Kinney** were named to the Penn State squad.

## LEADING THE DEFENSE

As American enters its second season in the Patriot League, its defense will be critical as it attempts to repeat as Patriot League champions. Leading the way will be All-America candidate, senior defender **Larry McDonald**. An All-Patriot League First-Team selection in 2001 and 2002 and the 2002 D.C. College Cup MVP, he is a steady force in the backfield for the Eagles who was also named to the D.C. College Cup All-Tournament team last year. He was named to the Penn State/Nike Classic All-Tournament team after AU won the tournament.

“Larry McDonald is one of the best center backs in the Patriot League and for that matter NCAA Division I,” head coach **Todd West** said about his senior captain. “He organizes the team from the back and also has the ability to dominate a game. He is excellent in the air and is also a very good passer. Larry will be a key factor for us as we try to defend our Patriot League title and make another run in the NCAA tournament. Larry is a winner.”

McDonald was named to the *Soccer America* Team of the Week for Aug. 30-Sept. 2 after his outstanding play in the D.C. College Cup. He earned the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week for Sept. 9 after anchoring the defense to three shutouts in its first four matches. He has also excelled off the field, making the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll with a 3.60 grade-point average in business information technology.

## PATRIOT LEAGUE LEADERS

AU is leading the Patriot League in a number of statistical categories this season. The Eagles are the most explosive offensive team in the league, leading in goals per game (2.11), assists per game (2.37) and points per game (6.58). The Eagles scored 40 goals this season with no other team in the Patriot League scoring more than 26.

Individually, **Andrew Herman** leads the league in points and goals while **Shawn Kuykendall** is first in assists. Herman is tied with **Kris Kuykendall** for third in assists while Shawn Kuykendall is second in points and fifth in goals. **Peter Philipakos** is also fifth in goals and sixth in points.

## GUARDING THE GOAL

An All-Patriot League Second Team performer last season, **Michael Behonick** has developed into one of the top goaltenders in the country and an All-America candidate.

Named to the Penn State/Nike Classic All-Tournament team earlier this year, Behonick currently owns a 1.22 goals against average. He has posted four shutouts this season and has won 10 matches.

## QUITE A WEEK FOR KINNEY

After spending most of the year without receiving much recognition, senior **Jeff Kinney** earned Patriot League and national recognition last week. First, Kinney earned Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week honors for Nov. 3 after his solid play in the backfield helped the Eagles tie Lehigh while playing a man down for 102 minutes.

The recognition didn't stop there for Kinney, as *Soccer America* named him to their Team of the Week for Oct. 28-Nov. 3. Kinney was one of 11 players nationally picked for the squad and the third Eagle this season.

Finally, on Nov. 7, Kinney was named to the Verizon Academic All-District II Team as a defender. A physics major with a 3.75 grade-point average, Kinney becomes the first AU student-athlete selected to the squad this year and the eighth since American entered the Patriot League in 2001.

# Todd West - Head Coach

A poised leader with a vision for raising American University's men's soccer to one of the elite programs in collegiate soccer, Todd West embarks on his third season as the Eagles' head coach and seventh overall with the program.



"I am thrilled for the opportunity to lead this program, one that will compete to advance to the NCAA tournament for several years to come," West said. "It is our intent to be a strong representative of the Patriot League and carry on our tradition of quality soccer and sportsmanship."

West has quickly fashioned the program in his own image - one that is tireless, fiery, and competitive - while still playing with the utmost professionalism. In just his second season as head coach, he guided the Eagles to the 2001 Patriot League championship, a berth in the NCAA Tournament where the club advanced to the Sweet 16, and a final national ranking of 14.

Continuing AU's outstanding tradition in NCAA Tournament play, West and his charges did not disappoint. American advanced to the Sweet 16 where it fell to eventual National Champion North Carolina, 1-0, in overtime. The Eagles had advanced after dispatching Ohio State (2-1) and Wake Forest (3-0) in the opening two rounds.

American finished 2001 with a 13-8-2 overall record and a 6-1-0 mark in Patriot League play. The Eagles claimed the league's automatic berth in the NCAAs after advancing past Holy Cross in the championship game on penalties, 4-3. It was American's inaugural season as a member of the Patriot League.

"What an incredible run we had," said West. "Our players worked hard for the success they enjoyed, and I could not be happier for them. Our season was in the balance at the midway point, but the effort and attention to detail improved, and we turned it around. I could not have asked any more of them."

West faced a challenging first season as head coach in the year 2000, as American played a schedule that was rated in the top-five nationally. The Eagles finished 7-9-2 overall, but came on strong late, posting wins in four of their final five matches. American also battled to an impressive 5-2-1 finish in the nationally-recognized Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), its final season as a member of the conference.

In addition to his duties at American, West was named an assistant coach of the U-20 U.S. National Team in May of 2002. He served under head coach Thomas Rongen, with whom he has had a long relationship. West also served as an assistant coach under Rongen with D.C. United, a three-time Major League Soccer (MLS) champion. While with United, West assisted in match preparation, player development, training sessions and scouting.

Before taking over the Eagle program, West spent four seasons as an assistant to former head coach Bob Jenkins. His tenure during that run was highlighted by the Eagles' trip to the 1997 NCAA Quarterfinals and a No. 5 national ranking. When West was named to take the helm of the program, Jenkins said, "I was excited to be able to hand the program over to such a competent and talented coach as Todd. He continues to be instrumental in the team's growth with his tireless recruiting, coaching and energy, and he will continue to build the program in the coming years."

A top-level student-athlete during his playing career, West is a 1988 graduate of George Mason University where he was a four-year starter for the Patriots. During his career at George Mason, West played in three NCAA tournaments and helped the program capture three CAA Championships. George Mason finished in the top 20 three times during his collegiate career.

West took over the reins at American after a stellar career as a high school, club, and Olympic Development coach in the Washington, DC,

metropolitan area. He served as the Head Boy's Coach at Lake Braddock Secondary School from 1993-1996, where he compiled a record of 47-13-6. His 1995 team captured the Virginia State Championship and finished with a #12 national ranking in the final poll. For his efforts, he was named 1995 NSCAA Virginia State Coach of the Year.

One of the most accomplished youth club coaches in Virginia and its Olympic Development Program (ODP), West has been associated with the organization since 1992. In 1998, West coached the 1983 (U-18) Virginia state team to an undefeated season and won the Region I ODP Championship. West was recently named an assistant coach on the U.S. Region I U-15 team.

West has led several Virginia club teams to success. His 1980 Braddock Road team won a state title, as well as several national tournaments, including the 1996 USA Cup in Blaine, MN, where they out-dueled an international pool of 85 teams. Recently his 1982-1983 Springfield Phoenix team advanced to the Virginia U-19 state finals.

West graduated from George Mason University in Fairfax, Va., with a bachelor of science in physical education and business. He holds a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "National A" Coaching license.

A native of Dallas, Texas, West and his wife, Samira (Sam), currently reside in Fairfax, Va.. The couple has two daughters, Kyra and Zoe.

Gary Kingsley begins his third season at American as a member of Head Coach Todd West's staff. Kingsley is responsible for several facets of the program's operation, including recruiting, scouting, and on-field instruction.

Largely responsible for the deep talent pool in the program, Kingsley is highly regarded as a recruiter.

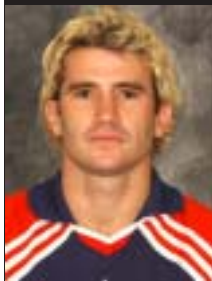
He has outstanding ties with youth soccer, and has spent several years as a coach in the Olympic Development Program (ODP). Prior to his appointment at American, Kingsley spent the previous nine years as Head Youth Coach in the South Florida United Youth Soccer Association working with Under-17, Under-16, and Under-14 premier soccer clubs.

A 1986 graduate of George Mason University in Fairfax, VA, with a bachelor of arts in Education, Kingsley captained the 1984 nationally-ranked Patriots while starting at central forward. He spent his freshman season at Wake Forest where he set the Demon Deacons' single-season assist record. He also was a member of the 1982 U.S. Olympic Under-23 team training for the 1984 Summer Olympics, before an injury ended his spot on the national side.

A graduate of nearby McLean High School, Kingsley was a *Washington Post* All-Met selection during his prep career. He currently holds the USSF National "A" Coaching License. Kingsley resides in Washington, D.C.

## Stephen Pedicini

*Assistant Coach*



Stephen Pedicini returns to American University in his first season as graduate assistant under Head Coach Todd West. A 2001 graduate of AU, Pedicini was a two-time co-captain for the squad, playing in the backfield.

Pedicini played for the professional soccer club the Connecticut Wolves of the A-League in 2001. He also was invited to preseason training with the D.C. United of Major League Soccer from the fall of 2001 to the spring of 2002.

Prior to attending AU, Pedicini played for two seasons at Philadelphia Textile where he was a First-Team All-Soccer Seven honoree. Pedicini graduated Cum Laude from American, earning a BSBA in International Marketing.

Pedicini played on the United States Under-17 National Team where he represented the United States in various competitions including the FIFA Under-17 World Cup in 1995. A two-time NSCAA All-American in high school, Pedicini was also 1997 New York State Gatorade Player of the Year. In addition, he was All-New York State three times.

Pedicini currently resides in Washington, D.C.

## Nick Stames

*Assistant Coach*



Nick Stames enters his seventh season as assistant coach at American, and his third as a member of Head Coach Todd West's staff. Stames' primary responsibilities lie with the development of the AU goalkeepers.

Under his tutelage, Eagle keeper Michael Behonick has developed into one of the finest in the East. The senior was an All-Patriot League selection in 2001, and has a legitimate chance at All-America status this year.

Stames has spent 13 years as a physical education teacher at Herndon Middle School in Herndon, Va. During that span, he developed his coaching skills, serving as goalkeeper coach for the Virginia Region I Olympic Development Program (ODP). Prior to that involvement, he coached at Marshall High School and at his alma mater, George Mason.
