The Coaches

American University is coached by **Shann Hart** (Norfolk State '88), who is in her fourth season leading the Eagles, and seventh overall as a collegiate head coach. Hart has a career record of 112-81 [.580]. Hart led American to 18 wins last season, the most since the 1997-98 season. She is assisted by **Glenn Rigney** (Miami '79), **Deb Reardon** (Assumption '86), **Brian Johnson** (Drexel '98) and graduate manager **Quintina Walker** (William & Mary '02).

Howard is coached by **Cathy Parson** (West Virginia '84), who is in her fourth season with the Bison. Parson owns a career record of 235-120 (.662), including a 52-37 (.584) record in three seasons at Howard. Parson is assisted by **Andre' Bolton** (Christopher Newport '97) and **JoVanka Lewis** (Hampton '98).

AMERICAN UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S BASKETBALL



LAST TIME OUT

The American University women's basketball team opened up the 2003-04 campaign with a 52-48 victory over UNC Asheville. **Chanel Spriggs** led the way with 15 points on six-of-11 shooting, and also dished out four assists and recorded four steals.

The Bulldogs went on a 6-1 run to take a 45-44 lead with just 4:15 remaining, but **Chanel Hunt** stepped up big. Hunt had picked up her third foul at 9:42 in the first half and was forced to sit for the rest of the half. However, with less than three minutes remaining, Hunt iced the game for the Eagles when she registered three straight steals. The steals helped AU extend its lead from one to five points. The thefts all occurred in just a minute and fifteen seconds (from 2:58-1:43). For the game Hunt managed five points, seven rebounds and six steals in 25 minutes of action.

American finished the first half up just four points, 27-23, but built the lead to seven points early in the second half. However, UNC Asheville went on an 8-0 run and took the lead with 11:15 remaining (35-34) on a layup by Shantell Waiters. After both teams traded baskets, **Angel McNatt** nailed a three-pointer to give AU the lead at 7:37. McNatt helped the Eagles add to the lead on the very next possession when she fed **Kim Salem** for a short jumper. Salem finished with nine points and four rebounds in 28 minutes of action.

THE OPPONENT AND THE HISTORY

This is the 15th meeting of American and Howard University. The Eagles have won seven of the last 10 contests between the inter-city rivals, including four of the previous five matchups. American enters this afternoon's action with a 1-0 record, coming off a win over UNC Asheville, 52-48. The Bison enter today's contest 0-1, losing to Villanova, 72-51, on Friday evening.

ON THIS DATE

American defeated future Patriot League foe Army on Nov. 23, 1997, for its third of 10 consecutive wins to start the season. The Eagles finished the 1997-98 season 23-7, and were invited to the Women's National Invitational Tournament, the best season in AU history.

THIEVERY

With 221 career steals, senior guard **Chanel Spriggs** ranks fourth on the AU all-time career steals list. If she continues on her current pace -- she nabbed 110 steals in her sophomore season and 107 last year, good for sixth in the NCAA in steals per game -- Spriggs will easily break the all-time school record of 244 steals, set by Jody Thornton between 1983 and 1987. Spriggs 110 steals in the 2001-2002 season set the school's single-season record for most steals. She established new AU, Patriot League and Bender Arena records with 11 steals against Holy Cross on Jan. 26, 2003. In addition, after her four steal effort versus UNC Asheville, Spriggs is just 10 steals away from cracking the top-10 for career steals in Patriot League history. Lafayette's Heidi Caruso, who played for the Leopards between 1990 and 1994, holds the Patriot League career steals record with 354. Meanwhile, **Chanel Hunt's** 83 steals in the 2002-03 season were the fourth most in a season in the history of the program. Hunt has 163 career steals, just 13 steals away from breaking into the schools top-10.

UP NEXT

American heads to Loyola College (Md.) on Sunday, Nov. 30. Game time is set for 2 p.m.

HOME, SWEET HOME

AU women's basketball has accumulated a 115-77 (.599) record in the friendly confines of Bender Arena, since the facility opened its doors on Jan. 23, 1988. American has had a winning home record in 12 of the last 13 seasons, going 102-51 (.667) during that span. Last season, the Eagles racked up 10 wins against just two losses in Bender. American hosts 12 regular season home games this season. The Eagles opened up Bender in style on Saturday, winning 52-48 over UNC Asheville.

KEEPIN' IT CLOSE

AU's 52-48 win over UNC Asheville in game one continues a trend it set last season. The Eagles participated in 13 games last season in which the final score was decided by single digits. American was victorious in nine of those 13 contests, with two of the losses coming in overtime.

PATRIOT LEAGUE PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

American has been selected by the Patriot League's coaches and sports information directors to finish second in the league. Ten-time Patriot League regular season champion Holy Cross was selected to win the league this year. The Crusaders were a near-unanimous selection to win the regular season title, with 14 out of a possible 16 first-place votes and 98 points. The Eagles were selected second with 84 points.

Meanwhile, junior forward **Chanel Hunt** was selected by the league's coaches and SIDs to the 2003-04 Preseason All-Patriot League Team. She was joined by Courtney Davidson from Navy, Katie Macfarlane from Army, Maggie Fontana from Holy Cross and Desire Almind from Bucknell. Hunt was among the league leaders last season in scoring (14.4 ppg), rebounding (7.3 rpg), assists (2.5 apg), steals (2.5 spg) and field goal percentage (.507).

HUNT(ING) 1,000 POINTS

After the first game this season, junior forward **Chanel Hunt** has 654 points, including 417 points last season (14.4 ppg). Hunt needs to average 13 ppg over the 27 scheduled regular season games to reach the 351 points needed to attain 1,000 career points. If Hunt maintains her 14.4 ppg scoring average from last season, she will score her 1,000th point on Feb. 20, 2004, at home against Holy Cross. Hunt would be just the 11th Eagle in school history to reach four-digits in scoring. Felicia Young is the school's all-time leading scorer, with 1,708 points.

RETURNING EAGLES

Three starters and nine letterwinners return from last year's 18-11 squad. Starters **Chanel Hunt** (14.4 ppg, 7.3 rpg), **Chanel Spriggs** (10.9 ppg, 3.7 spg) and **Joanna Barnes** (6.2 ppg, 3.7 rpg) made up 48.4 percent of the Eagles offense last season. Meanwhile, key reserves **Kaitlin Schuyler** (5.2 ppg, 2.6 apg), **Angel McNatt** (2.9 ppg), **Kim Salem** (2.7 ppg) and **Jenyce Woodruff** (2.5 ppg) all will look to make significant contributions this year.

BALANCED SCORING

Six different players took home top-scoring honors in individual games in the 2002-03 season. **Chanel Hunt** led the way, leading the team in scoring in 12 of the Eagles 29 contests, including a season-high 34 points against Navy on Feb. 11, 2003. **Chanel Spriggs** led the team in scoring in nine games, while **Katryn Costenbader** scored a team-high in points in six games. **Maria Werries** led the way three times and **Joanna Barnes'** 18 points versus Bucknell on Feb. 8, 2003, was her lone game leading the team in scoring. **Spriggs** led the Eagles with 15 points against UNC Asheville.

Scouting Report

Howard: The Bison are coming off a 72-51 loss to Philadelphia-area powerhouse Villanova, which received votes in the most recent ESPN/*USA Today* coaches poll. Howard was led by **Shannon Carlisle** and **Shauna Ruglass**, with eight points each, and seven points each from senior **Laura Askew** and junior **Daisha Hicks**.

Howard substituted liberally against Villanova, with all 15 players on their roster making an appearance in their season opener.

The Bison went without their leading returning scorer from the 2002-03 season, **Simone Agee**, against Villanova. According to the Howard sports information office, Agee is out with a knee injury. Agee averaged 11.1 ppg, 6.0 rpg and had 52 steals last season.

Howard finished the 2002-03 season with a 12-17 record, and returns three starters.

DISHING THE ROCK

Senior guard **Kaitlin Schuyler** has 225 assists in her three seasons at AU, good for eighth all-time. She is just five assists from seventh-place. Schuyler passed out a career-high 83 assists (3.5 apg) in the 2001-02 season, and followed that up with 75 assists in 29 games (2.6 apg) last year. In her freshman campaign, Schuyler dished out 65 assists in 23 games (2.8 apg). For her career, Schuyler has given out 2.9 assists per game. If she continues on that pace, Schuyler has a chance to move into fourth place on the school's all-time career assists list, behind Danielle Blackburn (340), Karen Jenkins (396) and the school's all-time leader, Jody Thornton, who had 693 assists between 1983 and 1987.

DISHING THE ROCK, PART II

Junior guard **Joanna Barnes'** 10 assists at Navy last season (2/11/03) tied her the third-highest total in a single game in school history. All-time career assist leader Jody Thornton had 12 assists versus Virginia Commonwealth University in 1984 and 11 assists versus University of North Carolina at Wilmington in 1985. Meanwhile, Karen Jenkins tallied 11 assists in a single game twice -- versus UNC-Wilmington and William & Mary, both in 1992.

SCHUYLER: SHARPSHOOTER

Senior **Kaitlin Schuyler** hit one three-pointer against UNC Asheville to give her 93 in her career, and tie her for fifth all-time in school history. Through her career, Schuyler has made 93 of 333 attempts (.279), which places her 10th all-time on the career three-point shooting percentage list. Schuyler just 12 treys behind former teammate Maria Werries 105 career three-pointers, and could take sole possession of second place this season.

THE NEWCOMERS

Head coach Shann Hart and her coaching staff bolstered the Eagles depth this past offseason by bringing in a highly touted recruiting class. Freshman **Kimeshia Junkins**, a 6-3 center from Columbus, Ohio, will be counted on to provide the Eagles with a post presence. Senior **Courtney Spellacy** is a 5-8 guard who transferred to American from Div. III Lewis & Clark College, where she earned two letters and was named Rookie of the Year. In addition, Spellacy finished second in the nation in assists per game (5.6) in her sophomore season and fifth in free throw percentage (89 percent). Freshman guard **Tara Williams** comes to American from Newport News, Va., where she starred for Heritage High School. During her time at Heritage, Williams was named to the All-District Second Team three times, was named the *Daily Press* Player of the Week, was a two-time team MVP and earned the best defensive player award. Transfer **Tala Hadavi** joins the Eagles from Virginia Commonwealth University. Hadavi will sit out this season because of NCAA transfer rules.

BUILDING ON SUCCESS

The Eagles' 18 wins last season were tied for the third-most in school history, behind a 23-win season in 1997-98 and two 20-win seasons in 1985-86 and 1986-87. AU's four league losses last season were the second least for the program, and its .621 win percentage was the fifth-best. The Eagles' 1,888 points were the fifth-most all-time, while the 2002-03 Eagles scoring defense, which gave up just 64.6 ppg and allowed opponents to shoot just .376 overall, was the best ever for an American squad. Last year's squad also ranked in the top-five in school history in average scoring margin, field goals made, field goal attempts, three-point field goals, three-point attempts, three-point defense, rebounds, assists, blocked shots, steals, turnovers caused, personal fouls and disqualifications.

BUILDING ON SUCCESS, PART II

If past results against the Eagles 2003-04 opponents are any indication of future performance, AU should have a successful season. The Eagles have a combined 102-51 (.667) record against the opponents on this season's schedule, and have a winning record when playing 13 of their 16 opponents which they have previously played. The Eagles records against 2003-04 opponents are as follows: Army, 4-3; Brown, 5-4; Bucknell, 6-3; Colgate, 5-1; Elon, 0-1; Holy Cross, 0-5; Howard, 8-6; Lafayette, 10-0; Lehigh, 7-2; Liberty, 4-0; Loyola (Md.), 6-2; UMBC, 5-3; UMES, 8-1; Mt. St. Mary's, 4-5; Navy, 10-7; and William & Mary, 26-11.
