WASHINGTON, D.C. (Sept. 8, 2008)—The American University Museum at the Katzen will hold ***Kids at the Katzen: From Goya to Cartoons***, for children ages five to 11, at 1 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 21.

Participants will work with museum staff and volunteers to create cartoons and caricatures based on the historical works of artist Francisco de Goya y Lucientes one of the artists in the exhibition [Ricardo Calero. Goya. Disparates...Continuity of an Unfinished Project](#) (on display through Sunday, Oct. 26).

The workshop will be held at Katzen Arts Center's rotunda and American University Museum. Parents are asked to remain with their child through the duration of the program and are welcome to participate in the program themselves.

The exhibition features Spanish artist Ricardo Calero who links his work with that of Francisco de Goya y Lucientes through an engraving series that explores the medium of light and similar aspects of human nature.
