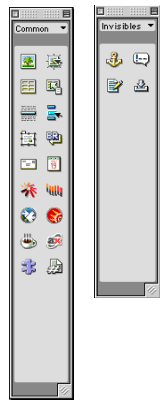
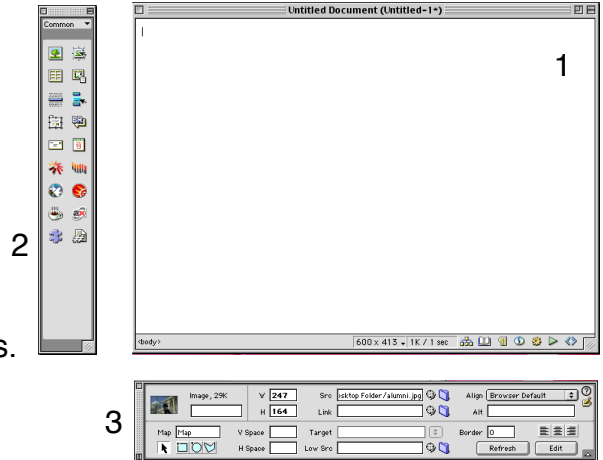

Macromedia Dreamweaver is a web authoring application. Some new features that make it superior to other editors include its ability to import HTML documents without reformatting the code, to easily integrate javascript and dynamic HTML, and to write relatively clean code which is simultaneously accessible when using the visual interface.

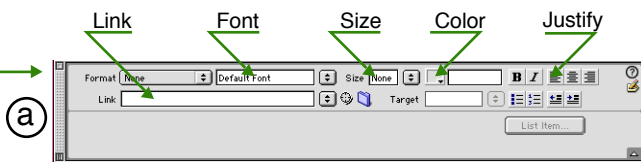
Dreamweaver's interface contains three main elements:

- 1- The document window
- 2- The object palette
- 3- The property inspector

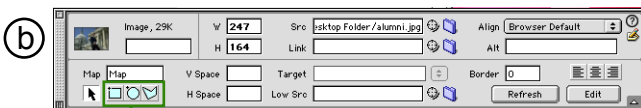
If these elements don't show when you launch the program, go to Window > Objects or Properties.



Most of the icons on the Object palette are also found in Insert top menu. The palette is used as a shortcut and can be placed anywhere on the desktop. The main common icons on the palette are: insert layer; insert image; insert table; insert rollover; insert E-mail link; shockwave and flash. From the top of the palette where it says "Common", choose "Invisibles" and select insert Named Anchor if you would like to use this feature to jump from the top of your page to any part of the same page or vice versa.



(a) When ready to insert any text, the property palette will automatically switch to a text property box, that will allow you to choose a font, the size of the font, the color, use a tab and link that text or part of it to a different page or a different web site.



(b) When an image is clicked, the property palette will look as shown in figure "b". You can apply a border to the image or link it to a different page or web site. The size of the image is indicated by the Height and the Width fields. One of the best features of Dreamweaver is the hotspot tool in the property inspector. Use those to link only part of an image to other pages or sites.
